Q. I don't have a group, but I want to send one or two students to camp, what do I do?

A. Individual campers are definitely welcome. Campers not already in a group will be put into a cabin of campers attending that specific week of camp.

Q. How is food handled at Institute?

A. If you send a group to camp, it's up to the local churches to provide food. However, Epworth can provide what is called "meals on wheels" food service for a per person fee.

Q. How are medications handled while at camp?

A. Though many campers in this age range are responsible enough to take their own medications.....All medications must be turned in to the camp medic and will be administered solely by this individual throughout the week.

Q. Where do we check in?

A. Registration is located at the Statue of Jesus (behind Wesley House) @ 6pm on the Sunday of the specific week of camp.

Q. How does check in work?

A. Bring any medication in its original container with the camper's name clearly marked on it and any money for additional Camp Merchandise and snacks from Cokesbury with you to registration...we'll take care of the rest.

Q. Where do leaders pick up mail and e-mail?

A. Leaders can pick up snail mail/email at the registration office.

Q. Why can't I get the cabin I requested?

A. We make our housing decisions based upon group size. Many times we don't make final decisions until the week before camp starts.

Q. Should I bring anything special to wear while at camp?

A. Some campers choose to dress up for Wednesday and Thursday evening assemblies—though this is not required.

Q. Is there a dress code for camp?

A. We believe that modesty and respect are the best approach to dress at camp. We ask that students honor God and respect themselves without causing distractions to other students in their dress.

Q. Can we do pranks at camp?

A. Pranking is greatly discouraged during camp as it can easily get out of hand and has great potential to emotionally or physically harm others.

Q. Can we have visitors come up for just a day?

A. Yes and No. Pastor's or church leaders may come up and visit camp. However, other guests such as friends and family may not. This allows for continuity of groups that have formed throughout the week.

Q. Can I work at Epworth?

A. Yes. Apply online at www.impact2818.com.

Q. Can I drive myself to camp?

A. Yes. Once on site, however, the vehicle will need to be parked, keys given to the spiritual director for that week of camp, and not used throughout the entire week of camp week. The keys may then be picked up from the spiritual director at the end of the week.

Q. If I only come for part of the week do I have to pay for the whole week?

A. Yes. All camp registration fees are based on whole event participation. There are no discounts for partial week participation.

Q. Do I have to pay for camp all at one time?

A. Yes. It is the policy of Impact 2818 that all registrations require full payment.
